Chairman's message

I was pleased to be part of the group representing the Luing Society at this year's Royal Welsh Show, where we had a good reception from both existing and potential breeders alike. There is encouraging interest in the breed, particularly in the upland parts of England and Wales due to favourable environmental schemes, particularly in England. Thank you to Craig Brook for providing two excellent heifers for display on the stand.

The Open Day held at Chatsworth Estate in August was an fine example of Luings in this type of environment, and attracted many new faces. Chatsworth has a varied set of environmental factors being situated in the Peak District, together with hosting a huge number of general public annually. The Luing herd fits the environment, are relaxed with the constant flow of people traffic, and produce the product that supplies the retail outlets with ease. Once again, thank you to David Howlett, farm manager at Chatsworth for hosting the Society this summer.

Council adopted a recommendation from the Promotions and Events Committee that we resurrect an pre-Covid plan to add one local show to our summer events schedule, which took us to Dalmally show on 7th September. Undoubtedly the warmest day of summer 2024 meant that both human and beast were unaccustomed to the unexpected conditions. Nevertheless, it was great to see many existing members, and especially good to welcome some new ones. Specific thanks must be awarded to Janet Pringle of Glenfinglas for stepping in at the last minute to provide two heifers for the stand.

The Council continues to work as a cohesive group, having taken in three new members following an election in February 2024. Council is working through the "To-Do" list and making good progress in bringing new initiatives, especially within the Breed Development Committee. As notified in the previous newsletter, there have been some minor adjustments to scoring dam temperament as part of the dam classification scheme, along with a change to female inspections for Society sales. This follows changes to scrotal measures for autumn bull inspections, implemented last year, among other items. The Breed Development Committee is rolling out a Benchmarking scheme in conjunction with SAC Consulting, which is fully funded – please get in touch if you would like to participate. We are mid way through a funded trial period with SIGNET, and have seen an encouraging increase in SIGNET membership over the last 12 months.

As we again approach the nomination season, we will be seeking 3 new Council members – nominations due in early November, please see the relevant section in this Newsletter and nomination form enclosed. This is an opportunity to work with the existing group to further the Luing breed. For those who are thinking of putting themselves forward, please have a look at the Director's Handbook which is available on the website.

I'd like to remind breeders that we have a relatively newly published web page focusing on Luing Beef – nativebeef.co.uk. Please have a look and we would like to hear from any member who has their own farm shop, is supplying a local farm shop, or is providing a mail order service – and is currently not featured in our list of members who supply this service. Please drop us an email along with your logo, and we will add you to the list.

Our Fieldsman is engaged in bull inspections and dam classifications over the autumn. Following the undoubted success of the first spring sale held within the Spring Bull Sales schedule at United Auctions Stirling, Council have agreed to once again include this sale in its official Society Sale calendar. The sale is to be held on the same day as the Simmental sale, and a more detailed timetable will be available nearer the time. Entries should be made as normal, on Grassroots. This additional sale is an option, which is in addition to the Premier Sale to be held at Castle Douglas on 7th February.

I would like to thank the many members and Council members who help with our events; putting up and taking down the stand, manning the stands, providing refreshments and display cattle. Society promotion at events is an important part of our strategy and takes an enormous effort from many people, which is much appreciated.



Council Nominations

The Luing Council has 3 retiring members at the next AGM for which nominations are sought for these three places. A nomination form is included with this mailing which must be fully completed and returned to the Secretary by Thursday 7th November.
